Food Security and Economic Empowerment Program Expansion

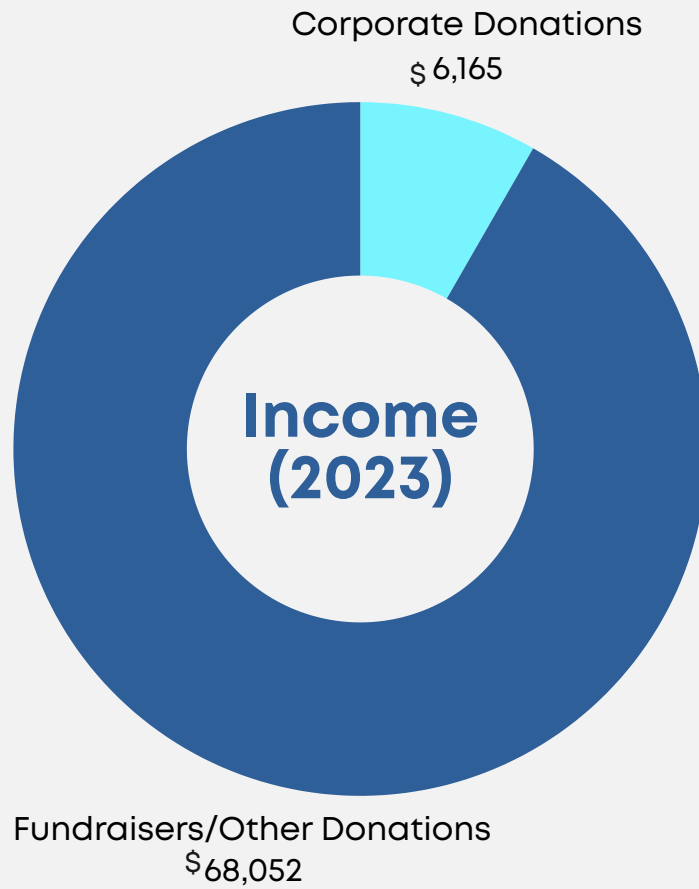

The year concluded with free language classes in Yoruba and Igbo.



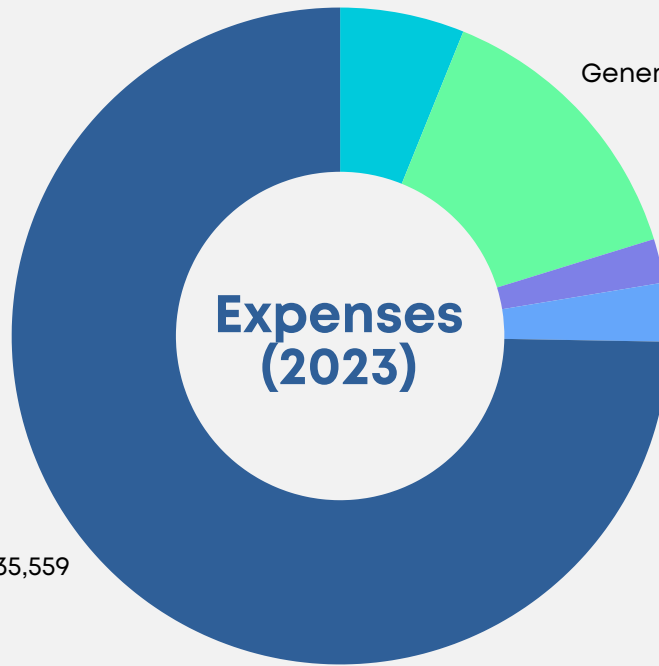

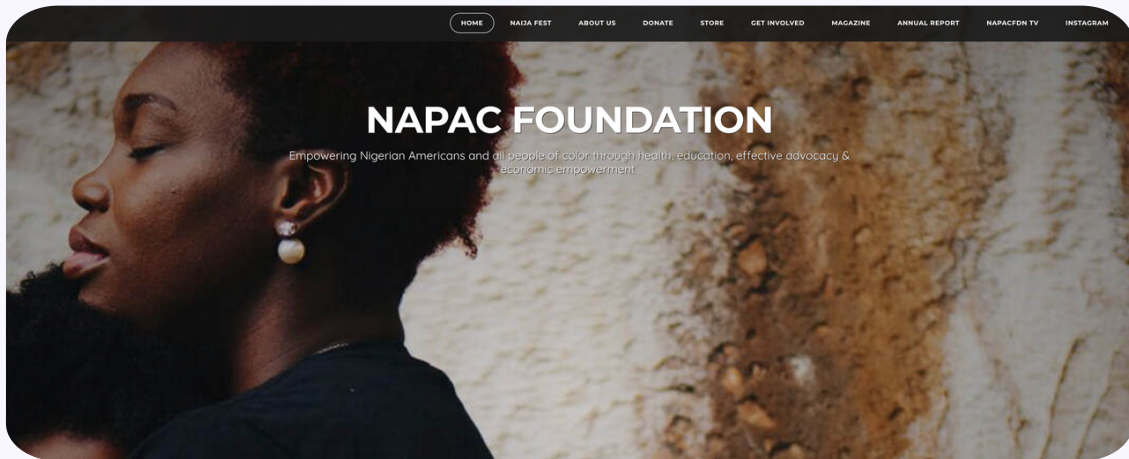
